# **CONDITIONAL TYPE O**

Conditional type 0 is:	
If + present ₄	present
a. Examples:	It is used for scientific truths.
If water <b>gets</b> 100° C, it <b>boils</b> .	
If you <b>heat</b> butter, it <b>melts</b> .	
If you <b>put</b> salt into water, it <b>dissolves</b> .	
b.	Routines or habits:
We can replace <b>If</b> here by <b>when</b>	
Examples:	
If/when it rains, she doesn't go to scho	ol.
If /when I <b>travel</b> to Rabat, I <b>eat</b> meatba	lls in Zaida.
If /when I <b>do</b> my homework, I <b>listen</b> to	music.
If/when he <b>gets up</b> early, he <b>walks</b> to w	vork. scout
CONDTIONAL TYPE I:	
If + present ▼	future
(cause)	(effect)
Conditional type I is used for a cause ar	nd effect. If I do this cause, what is the effect?

it will break.

(effect)

(cause)

If I **drop chalk** on the floor **▼** 

If I do this cause of (dropping chalk) now (in the present) or tomorrow (in the future), the effect will be (breaking). The action is possible in the present or in the future.

#### More examples:

If you don't pay attention in class, you won't understand the lessons.

She will be late **if** she doesn't hurry.

If he eats a lot, he will get fat.

We'll go for a picnic if it doesn't rain tomorrow.

#### **CONDITIONAL TYPE II:**

If + simple past

Would+ verb

Conditional type II is used for an action which is imaginary in the present.

A girl says:" If I were a boy, I would sit in cafes."

Is it possible for a girl to be a boy? What the girl is saying is unreal, imaginary. Therefore, the action is impossible in the present.

Someone says:" If I were a bird, I would fly freely in the sky."

An obese woman says:" If I were slim, I would put on jeans."

A busy man says:" If I had time, I would practice tennis."

#### **CONDITIONAL TYPE III:**

#### If + past perfect ▼

would + have + past participle

Conditional type III is used for an action which happened in the past and we say if the opposite happened.

I got up late yesterday, so I missed the bus.

If I hadn't got up late yesterday, I wouldn't have missed the bus.

What I say now is the opposite of what happened in the past.

I didn't know that you were sick, so I didn't visit you.

If I had known that you were sick, I would have visited you.

The test was difficult, so I didn't answer all the questions.

If the test hadn't been difficult, I'd have answered all the questions.

He **drove** quickly, so he **had** an accident.

He wouldn't have had an accident if he hadn't driven quickly.

# **WISHES**

Wish or if only + past perfect is used for regret in the past.

Fatima married someone she didn't know and she regrets that.

She wishes she hadn't married him.

The test was difficult and Brahim regrets that.

If only the **test hadn't been** difficult.

Samir **drove** dangerously and had an accident. He regrets it.

I wish I hadn't driven dangerously.

He **didn't have** much time. He was very busy. If only I **had** had time.
